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**"Meaning-Text" Theory as a new age linguistical approach**

This paper presents a linguistical approach to a bidirectional chain of levels under the light of "Meaning-Text" Theory or MTT. The "Meaning-Text" Theory (MTT) aims at represent explicitly the m:n correspondance between Texts/Sounds and Meanings of Natural language L utterances. In the year 1965 at Moscow, MTT was written by Igor Mel'čuk and Alexander Zholkovsky. In that case MTT is that each language L is described by a Meaning-Text Model (MTM), that is a symbolic model, including a finite set of rules, which defines the correspondance between the set of possible semantic representaion of L and the set of possible phonetic representation of L.
